



# VETERINARY SURGEONS BOARD OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

## APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL OF ACCREDITATION OF FACILITY AS A VETERINARY HOSPITAL

1. Subject to the *Veterinary Practice Act 2003* (the 'Act'), a facility is eligible for renewal of accreditation as a veterinary hospital for a 3 year period if the Veterinary Surgeons Board of South Australia determine that the requirements for accreditation continue to be met.
2. An application for renewal of accreditation as a veterinary hospital must:
  - a. be made by completing Form J: *Application for Renewal of Accreditation of Facility as Veterinary Hospital*; and
  - b. be accompanied by the prescribed application fee fixed under the Act.
3. An applicant for renewal of accreditation as a veterinary hospital must facilitate inspection of the facility by a person authorised by the Board.
